Dear Parent/Carer

We have enjoyed a very busy and extremely positive start to the new school year.

Our GCSE examination results this Summer exceeded our already high expectations and were our best ever. Just over 55% of students achieved five A*-C grades including English and Maths, 89% of students gained five or more A*-C, 96% of students achieved at least five A*-G grades and 100% of students achieved at least one A*-G grade. We are awaiting the results from the examination boards of remarks so these results could yet increase.

We had further cause for celebration post-16 where we achieved a pass rate of 99% with 48% of passes at Grades A*-B at A level. We are very pleased that all students have been accepted on their chosen courses at universities across the country.

It is not therefore surprising that we have enrolled over 220 students into Year 12 from last years Y11 at Wath and also from many other schools across the borough and beyond. Our sixth form team Mr Naylor, Mrs Shaw and Mr John have been extremely busy processing applications, interviewing prospective students and matching their course preferences.

Across our school community we continue to focus on raising academic standards and attainment and remain committed to our aim to ensure that all our students receive a high quality educational experience and leave us **able, active and qualified.**

The 300 students who have just joined us in Year 7 appear to be settling in quickly and are successfully finding their way round our very large school. In order to take the maximum benefit from the extensive opportunities available here we are encouraging them to get involved in the many activities offered through the extra-curricular life of the school.

We also welcomed several new members of staff at the beginning of term and offer them our very best wishes in their career at Wath.

As parents/carers you have an enormous part to play in your child's success. We look forward to continuing to work in partnership with you over the coming year.


