Charlie Bringlow, Charlie Thompson & Brayden Turner, all in Year 11 immediately went to support the woman. Without hesitation one of the students phoned 999 for an ambulance, one student attended the nearby surgery to call for assistance, whilst the third pupil took off his white school shirt, to stem the bleeding from the lady's head.

Three nurses then attended at the scene to support until the ambulance arrived.

Feedback from the nurses was if the pupils had not exhibited such initiative and quick thinking, the female would have sustained a more serious outcome to her injuries.

After attending hospital by ambulance/paramedics, the lady received 12 staples to the skull (top of the head), and has a cut to the nose and black eyes.

We are incredibly proud of the three boys. Their quick thinking demonstrated their selfless and caring attitudes, they are a true credit to our community. Their actions prevented the situation from being much worse.

Inspector Caroline Bakewell from the Rotherham North Neighbourhood Policing Team got in touch with the academy in order to reward the boys. She and her team attended the academy to award the boys with a District Commanders Good work Minute. She

also said:

"On behalf of the Rotherham Command Team I would like to pass on our thanks to Charlie, Charlie and Brayden. Due to their prompt actions and initiative the member of the public received first aid and the help she required. The community spirit and resilience demonstrated is exemplary and well deserving of a District Commanders Good work Minute."
