
Success Stories

On Sunday, students and teachers from the Academy will also be present at the service held at Wath Parish Church on Remembrance Day.




Y11 Trials



LACK OF AGE VERIFICATION

that it is for people ages 19 or above. There's no age verification, however, so a young person could simply sign up under a laise date of birth. The app's algerithm claims to match users of similar ages (making them mare compatible) but either the algerithm isn't very rollable, or most users have entered a take age which desert correspond with their profile pic.

REWARDS FOR REPEATED USE

Amigo gifts virtual coins to users if they reply to messages within 10 seconds, while there are also deliv, resource for posting comments, sharing a video, getting likes or simply opening the app. It also encourages increasing instruction of the comments with other users to unlock entre featurest ence someone's online threndship reaches intimacy level 3, they can hold one-to-one video coils with each other.

Advice for Parents & Carers

MONITOR DOWNLOADS

As well as frequent catch-ups with your child about what they've enjoyed doing online, you could consider taking the additional step of physically checking their phone every so often to see which apps they ve installed. BLOCK, REPORT, DISCUSS

Many children already know that connecting with strangers online is dangerous, but it never hurts to refresh their memory. Whatever communication apps your child uses, make sure they're fully aware that it anything online makes them leel uncomfortable, scored or upset, then they can block the user responsible, report the content, take a screenshot as evidence and some to tell you straight away.

ACTIVE LISTENING

If your child does approach you with a consern, make time to stop what you're doing and actively listen, Let them talk without interrupting or showing any judgement, then discuss their options and the possible solutions: this empowers them and reassures them that you're there to be supportive. If the issue is one that has put your child at risk, however, you may wish to contact the police.



WATH ACADEMY LIBRARY

Mrs Frith and Mrs Laite offer you a warm welcome to Wath Academy Library, which is located on the first floor, above Social Area 2. The Library provides a friendly space for students to read, do homework and take part in enrichment activities, many of which are student-led. The Library is open to all year groups at break and lunchtime, and homework club is offered after school from 2.50pm-3.50pm every day. IT and printing facilities are provided.

All students have a library account, meaning they can borrow books. The library has a stock of over 3000 fiction and non-fiction books which are regularly updated according to popularity and student requests. Books cater for a range of abilities and interests, whilst covering a variety of themes, ensuring that all students are represented and diversity is celebrated. In addition, the library has subscriptions to a daily newspaper and a number of magazines.

Students can use the library management system, Accessit, to search the library database, this can be accessed via the school Learning Platform. eBooks are available via the "ePlatform by Wheelers" app, meaning students can read books digitally on an electronic device. Students can also volunteer to become Student Librarians, giving them the opportunity to develop their skills and get to know other students.
