




Building teamwork, confidence and community through competition

Department Focus Media Studies

The Department of Media Studies is having a very successful year so far. Our Year 12 cohort – the largest for several years – has adapted to the demands of A Level very well and students are already producing some excellent analysis.

The Year 12 students are the first to be tackling the updated media products set by the exam board. The new products are deliberately more diverse to better reflect the modern world. Thus, students have been exploring the representation of disability in Channel 4's trailer for the Paralympics, as well as the changing representation of women in historical and contemporary advertising. They have now moved on to newspapers, deconstructing how The Daily Mirror and The Times reported on the Boris Johnson 'partygate' scandal. Videogames are next.



Having completed their practical non-exam assessment productions to a professional standard, Year 13 are focusing on consolidating and enhancing their knowledge as the end of the course approaches. They have been refining higher level skills, such as evaluating academic theories, and are making great progress. Our subscription to the Essential Media Theory website has been particularly useful for students to revise and test themselves.

Many of our past students are forging very successful careers in the media or elsewhere. As highlighted in last week's newsletter, one of our alumni is now a reporter for ITV News Calendar. We recently heard from another former student who is now a brand marketing manager for a videogames developer. We are very proud of these students (and many others), who demonstrate what a versatile and useful subject Media Studies is.
