As required by the Education and Skills Funding Agency (ESFA), the purpose of this statement is to set out how Wath Academy will use its 16 to 19 tuition fund allocation to support students who have been academically disadvantaged due to Covid-19.

How Wath Academy will use the 16 to 19 tuition fund

The 16 to 19 tuition fund will be used to provide small group tuition for students aged 16 to 19 who have not yet achieved a Grade 4, or above, in English and/or Maths or are from an economically disadvantaged background.

The provision will not be limited to tuition for English and Maths, but will also be used to help students progressing on Academic and Applied courses where assessment may have been impacted as well as supporting high achieving disadvantaged students to achieve their full potential.

Tuition groups will comprise of no more than seven students and tuition sessions will be scheduled in addition to the planned programme of study hours already timetabled for the academic year 2021-22.

Tuition and additional support will be delivered using a combination of delivery methods that include:

- GCSE exam re-sit preparation
- Study support/catch up skills for Applied students
- Third party providers

Tuition support offered will be based on an individual needs assessment, the identification of an individual starting point, clear learning goals, expectations and outcomes.

Wath Academy is committed to ensuring the tuition fund is used in accordance with the Government's guidance on the 16 to 19 tuition and therefore we will:

- Produce the 16 to 19 tuition fund statement of intent, publish it on our website, explaining how the fund will be used to support the most disadvantaged students.
- Record the use of the fund, including reference to:
 - Individual students who receive support
 - The needs of those students
 - The number of hours of tuition delivered
 - Retain evidence of the tuition provided
- Deliver the extra tuition and spend the allocated funds in the academic year 2020/21
- Notify the Education Skills and Funding Agency (ESFA) of any underspend from the fund in order for it to be reclaimed.
